XAVIER TALTON, STERLING

Xavier Talton ranked seventh on the latest VarVee statewide assists leader board, but it was his ability to put the ball in the basket that sparked Sterling to a 57-38 victory over Windsor Saturday for the 4A state title. The junior guard tossed in three three-pointers in scoring a season-high 22 points in the championship tilt and averaged 21.3 points over Sterling's final three tournament games. Talton is better known as the playmaker for a balanced lineup in which Derek Karg, Bobby Lebsock and Aaron Reyes all joined him in averaging between 12 and 15 points per game. Espn.com touted him as "an athletic lead guard with good speed and quickness. Xavier has a chance to become an outstanding player if he keeps working on his game." Talton has had as many as 11 rebounds and 11 assists in a game, but never in the same game. A triple-double would seem to be within his grasp, although grabbing another state title should be motivation enough for his senior campaign.

FAITH CHRISTIAN, CO

Although it graduated all five starters from last year's state championship team, Faith Christian was able to claim its fourth straight state title with a 49-41 victory over its Metropolitan League rival, Jefferson Academy, in Saturday's 3A championship game. Junior Nathan Rindels, in a tie for third place on VarVee's latest statewide assists leader board, displayed his versatility by scoring 19 points and grabbing 10 rebounds in the title game. Faith Christian (26-1), which won its last 24 games, relied on its defense during its state tournament run. It limited Pagosa Springs to just 12 second-half points in a 48-30 victory in the semifinal round and held Jefferson Academy to 24 points over the first three quarters on Saturday. Rindels was the Arvada school's leading scorer, with classmate Derek McCartney and senior Jordon Colson also averaging in double figures. With Rindels, McCartney, Adam Finnefrock and Alex Buchman returning, Faith Christian won't require the complete overhaul it undertook this season to garner a fifth consecutive title next year.
